Public Comment: Guest Kenny Elko commented regarding masking and vaccinations, noting he disagrees with mandated vaccinations and requiring students to wear masks; Mr. Elko also requested information on the expenditure of Covid funds.

Points of Interest: Board Member Carter Chapman announced Coach Betrus was named as Section V Coach of the Year for the second year in a row, commending Mr. Betrus on his work with the Boys Soccer Team.

Board Member Kelley Louthan noting Cross Country Team top runner Drew Reigelsperger competed in the state Championship, and was in the lead with two other boys when one of the runners passed out and Drew and another of the lead runners stopped to assist the other runner, and encouraged him to finish the race, adding this action speaks for our athletes and how awesome our students are. Mr. Louthan stated Drew will be competing to compete on Long Island for a competition this coming weekend.

Board Member Thomas Hawks stated he had grown up in Naples and raised his children in Naples, noting he is really proud of his community and the school, stating as a resident of Naples he is very proud.

Superintendent Recognitions and Updates:

Claims Auditor Quarterly Report – Claims Auditor Evelyn Letta presented the 1st quarter report, noting that this is the busiest quarter of the year and the error rate was still very low at 0.006%.

Director of Business and Operations Chad Hunt reported the District will be holding a presentation for the public on the proposed Capital Project in the High School Auditorium November 30th at 6:30 p.m., adding there will be a staff presentation the day before as well, announcing the Capital Project vote will be held on December 7th from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the High School Library.

Superintendent Black announced that Student Representative Max Ryan was attending an ROTC event and so he was unable to attend the meeting. Dr. Black then spoke briefly about interscholastic sports and also mentioned it is the time of year for seniors to get their college applications submitted.

Superintendent Black noted the District is developing protocols to make it safe for students and guests during the Elementary and High School concerts. Dr. Black stated the District is watching what is happening at the county level and preparing contingencies in the event our Covid infection numbers increase.

Dr. Black stated the parent/teacher conferences were pretty successful, noting most parents selected to Zoom for the meetings; State Law required the District to test unvaccinated employees on a weekly basis, noting our results have been all negative for the last three weeks; Yesterday was School Support Staff Day, recognizing all of the support staff for their contributions to our school.

Board Member Kelley Louthan presented the Budget Committee minutes stating 95.2% of the school taxes have been collected, which is about average year-to-year, with the remainder turned over to the county for collection and penalty; the year is off to a great start with budget projections spot on and no major areas of concern at this time; Federal Stimulus update; the District will be losing our Technology support from BOCES on December 28th and the District is exploring different options to replace that coverage.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE NAPLES CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT
AND THE NAPLES TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION

WHEREAS, the Naples Central School District (hereinafter referred to as, "District") and the Naples Teachers' Association (hereinafter referred to as, "Association") have agreed to a Collective Bargaining Agreement (hereinafter referred to as, "CBA") effective from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Article VIII(B) of the CBA states coaches will receive experience credit to receive more points for years coached within the sport; and

WHEREAS, the CBA does not discuss differences between a sport and a club; and

WHEREAS, the current Modified Boys Soccer Coach, Thomas N. Mannella III, received credit for advising the indoor soccer club when being awarded his experience points and pay; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have met to discuss this unique situation and wish to resolve this matter amicably and in the best interest of students, the community, the NTA, and the District.

THEREFORE, the parties agree to the following:

1. Thomas N. Mannella III will continue to receive the salary he and the District agreed upon based on credit for his experience as an advisor for the indoor soccer club for the remaining 2021-2022 soccer season. If Thomas N. Mannella III coaches soccer next year, he will only receive experience credit for time spent as a soccer coach, not a club advisor.
2. For all future coaching experience, only time spent as a coach, rather than as a club advisor, will count toward experience points. For example, time spent as the advisor for the indoor soccer club will not count as experience points towards a soccer coach.
3. This Memorandum of Agreement shall represent the full and complete agreement between the parties and no other claims, actions or proceedings of any kind whatsoever will be commenced by any of the parties hereto.
4. This Memorandum of Agreement does not establish a precedent or constitute a past practice between the parties, unless stated herein.
5. Both parties enter this Memorandum of Agreement, knowingly, freely without coercion.

6. Signatures below indicate all parties being duly authorized have read the foregoing and enter into this Memorandum of Agreement.
7. Should any provisions of this Memorandum of Agreement be declared or determined by any court or reviewing officer or entity to be illegal or invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions shall not be affected thereby and the illegal or invalid provision shall be severed from this Memorandum of Agreement, provided severance of the invalid or illegal provision does not defeat the intent of the parties as reflected in this Memorandum of Agreement.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE NAPLES TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION
AND THE
SUPERINTENDENT FOR THE
NAPLES CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Naples Central School District (“District”) and the Naples Teachers’ Association (“NTA” or “Association”) (collectively referred to as the “Parties”) have agreed to a Collective Bargaining Agreement effective from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2022 (“CBA”); and

WHEREAS, Article III, B. Substitute Activity, of the CBA states that in recognition of the importance of non-teaching periods for preparation, planning, and remedial instruction, the parties agree that unit members as currently defined by Article I will not ordinarily be asked to assume the class responsibilities of a teacher who is absent for an entire day, and the District will not assign a teacher to substitute for an entire day unless after its best efforts it cannot obtain a satisfactory substitute teacher for the day.; and

WHEREAS, the District anticipates an increase in need for substitute teachers for the 2021/2022 school year and beyond; and

WHEREAS, the parties have had discussions concerning allowing unit members the option of covering the class of a teacher who is absent, in lieu of a planning period (up to forty-five (45) minutes in length); and

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed to the parties as follows:

1. Participation will be optional, with a unit member’s consent.
2. The parties agree that this agreement only applies when a request for coverage comes from the District.
3. The parties agree that unit members would only be able to cover one class period per day.
4. The parties agree that unit members would be compensated at a rate of \$30.00 for each class period covered.
5. The parties agree that there will be no expectation of preparation/planning by the unit member covering the class.

6. The parties agree that the option to cover a class in lieu of a planning period will only be available to unit members with at least one (1) year of teaching experience in the Naples Central School District.
7. The parties agree that the option to cover a class in lieu of a planning period only applies to period/learning blocks scheduled between 7:55 a.m. and 2:29 p.m.
8. This agreement shall take effect upon execution of all of the parties named below and may not be amended or altered without express written consent of all parties.
9. Both parties enter into this Memorandum of Agreement knowingly, voluntarily and without coercion, after having an opportunity to review it with a representative of their choice.

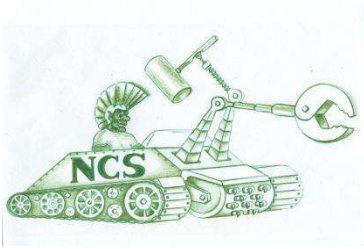
