Naples Elementary School Board of Education Updates ~ September 2017



Welcome back to school! We have had a fantastic opening so far at Naples Elementary!! We are thrilled to welcome 372 students to our building, and 3 new staff members to the Naples Elementary family: Miss Houppert (Grade 5), Miss Eisinger (Special Education), and Mrs. Fitzgerald (Math Intervention). We also welcome Mrs. Hall as a substitute in 3rd Grade. Mrs. Hall has been doing an absolutely wonderful job getting her classroom off to a great start as we move through the interview process. After an "action packed" summer full of professional development and intervention programming, we have all returned energized and ready for an amazing school year! We have many new things happening at Naples Elementary that we will be updating you on in the coming months. Here is some exciting news as we continue our discussion on district priorities:

Increasing STEAM Opportunities and Student Engagement: As you know, we now have a classroom space dedicated to STEAM Education. The "STEAM Lab" is right next to our technology lab, and provides an environment to support our technology curriculum additions thanks to the smart schools funding. This year we are adding additional Breakout EDU opportunities, EV3 LEGO kits, STEAM carts and more!! This room also provides a consistent location for our MakerSpace program. Mrs. Wordingham continues to work with teachers to schedule times to use this great learning space for enrichment opportunities when it is not being used by technology classes. She is working with teachers in grades 4-6 to offer additional STEAM activities for students not enrolled in chorus (which currently has 82 students signed up!). Our staff has truly embraced "the Arts" in STEAM, and this is another example of making sure all students have enrichment opportunities. In addition to all of these uses, our STEAM Lab provides an in-school location for our Elementary robotics program. Enrollment in this program is at an all time high, and we are so appreciative of Mrs. Schwartz and her amazing parent volunteers who dedicate so much time to this extracurricular activity.

ELA Curriculum Focus: We are thrilled to have Carrie Grove continue in the role of an Instructional Coach this year. As a teacher on special assignment, we felt it was important to set interconnected priority goals for the 2017-2018 school year that are driven by building needs, and support all staff and students. Our priority goals are the following:

1. Curriculum Mapping
 - Maintaining/updating math curriculum maps
 - Completing the work started last year on curriculum maps for ELA

- Developing the same high quality curriculum maps for Science, utilizing the expertise of Jeff Liebentritt and Brittany Ritz who attended Science Curriculum writing this summer though BOCES, as well as our new Discovery Ed "techbooks" and streaming resources.
2. RTI Support to the Reading and Math Specialists
 - Benchmarking has already been completed and we are proud to say we have never been ready to jump into intervention groups this close to the start of the school year! Carrie has done an excellent job streamlining the process for benchmarking and developing instructional groupings!
 - Running quality data meetings with the Principal and Director of Pupil Personnel that focus on instructional and curricular changes based on data analysis (**2017-2018 benchmarking, progress monitoring, and data meeting dates have already been determined*)
 - Systems management (RTIM, AIMSweb and LLI)
 - Resource management
 3. Instructional Coaching: Support staff, paraprofessionals and students by engaging in collaborative work around curriculum and instructional strategies. Carrie will have an active role in the mentoring process this year by doing monthly classroom visits and meetings with new teachers.
 4. Support the implementation of "Handwriting without Tears" and "Being a Writer" in grades UPK and Kindergarten. These programs complement and enhance our Lucy Calkins writing curriculum.
 5. Support the expansion of our Safety Patrol Program



Open House will be on Thursday October 5th from 6:30-7:30 pm. Our Naples School Association (NSA) will host an ice cream social in the Elementary cafeteria. Ice cream can be purchased for \$1.00 and proceeds will go to supporting NSA's efforts to provide financial support for school field trips and other educational opportunities throughout the school year such as the "NSA Fun Nights". We are working with Mrs. Kingston to offer a dinner option for families who would like to have dinner before Open House begins. We are also working with Mrs. VandeSande and Mrs. Finnan to possibly provide a flu shot clinic that evening as well. I am thrilled to already have multiple organizations reach out to have tables set up during Open House so they are able to offer information regarding their community programs. ☺

OPENING OF SCHOOLS

- Our welcome back to teachers and staff occurred on Wednesday, August 30, and Thursday, August 31. Superintendent Frahm delivered an inspirational opening day address, which served as the perfect segue into two incredible days of professional development. Teachers engaged in learning specific to *Schoology*, *Discovery Ed Techbooks*, *Discovery Ed Video Streaming*, *1:1 Device Rollout at the HS*, *CoTeaching at the Secondary Level*, *Data Discussions*, and many other topics of interest and relevance to our work with students and in complete alignment with our District Priorities (Engagement, Literacy, STEAM).

- Naples JRSR High School opened their doors to students on Tuesday, September 5th. Students arrived to school with eager, smiling faces and have quickly demonstrated their readiness to learn. In effort to foster "community" and to lay the foundation for a safe and supportive learning environment, "Opening Day" assemblies were held for all students by grade level. During the assemblies, we explored the district mission and the role of the student in that mission. Additionally, we kicked off the Naples High School Learner Profile, RISE (Respect, Integrity, Safety and Excellence) with a video message from faculty (see below).

WELCOME HANNAH KIMMEL, HS SCIENCE DEPARTMENT!

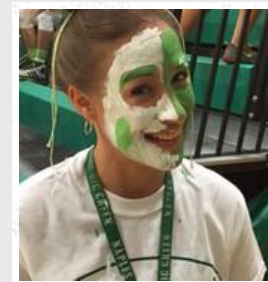

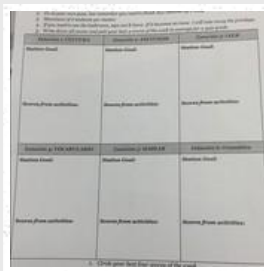

2017-18 LAUNCH: TECHNOLOGY INITIATIVE, 1:1 CHROMEBOOK ROLLOUT AT THE HIGH SCHOOL



- The High School is excited to continue moving forward with the 1:1 device program. All 7th and 8th graders have been issued iPads and have the opportunity to utilize them both in and out of the classroom.
- All Ninth thru Twelfth Graders have been provided with Chromebooks. These devices afford students access to a keyboard and Google Apps.
- Schoology, the new learning management system (similar to Blackboard or Angel in college) is up and running. Students with 1:1 devices are being introduced to Schoology simultaneously as devices are being distributed. Accounts are available for all other students as well.
- Kudos to Anneke Radin-Snaith, Lew White and Bernie Barnowski for their diligent efforts to roll this initiative out so seamlessly in our building.

2017-18 LAUNCH: DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP

Why are we teaching digital citizenship?

2017-18 LAUNCH: RESPONSE TO INTERVENTION

Agreed Upon Assumptions:

- All children do not learn in the same way.
- All children do not learn at the same rate / speed.
- All children do not arrive to school with adequately developed academic and social behaviors.
- An individual teacher cannot meet EVERY NEED of EVERY INDIVIDUAL student. We must embrace an "all hands on deck" approach.

What RtI Is:

- A **multi-tiered system of supports** (MTSS) designed to ensure EVERY child may receive the additional time and support necessary to learn and achieve at high levels.



- [What it IS NOT](#): A process of documentation to achieve classification in special education.

Rtl at Naples High School

- This summer, a High School team met on July 11 and July 12 to explore Response to Intervention and current levels of support for struggling students at the secondary level. The team conducted a book study of the text, **It's About Time**, by Mike Mattos. Mattos is an innovative leader in the educational professional community who has explored, researched, piloted, written about, and presented on **Response to Intervention** and **Professional Learning Communities**. Below represents the collaborative recommendations and work of this team (principal, counseling staff, psychologist, gen. ed. and special ed. teachers) :

Tier 1 Launch at the HS

- **RISE - Respect, Integrity, Safety, Excellence:** The High School is proud to kick off and share our behavioral expectations / learner profile attributes with students.
- **RISE Assembly** - On September 5, all students participated in opening day assemblies. The focus of these assemblies was the District mission and student role in the mission and rollout of RISE (Respect, Integrity, Safety, Excellence).
- **Cafe Boosters** - Videos specific to each of the various settings (cafe, bathroom, hallways) were created and will be shared with students.
- **Posters** - RISE posters which explicitly articulate expectations and language surrounding Respect, Integrity, Safety and Excellence are mounted throughout the building.
- **Announcements** - Morning announcements include a quote specific to one of the following attributes: Respect, Integrity, Safety, and Excellence.
- **Digital Citizenship and AntiBullying Curriculum** - All students have access to the Digital Citizenship curriculum, as outlined above.

Tier 2 Launch at the HS (5-15% of population)

- **Leveled Literacy Intervention:** To catch up to their achieving peers, most struggling readers need to double or triple their rate of reading acquisition. Few struggling readers get sufficient expert, intensive reading instruction to actually acquire the NECESSARY doubled / tripled rate of reading development to catch up with their peers. The Leveled Literacy Intervention is a researched based approach to remediate gap skills in reading. This year at Naples JrSr High School, all students in grades 7 -9 identified as needing ELA Academic Support Services will have access to this intervention during ELA workshop. Joelle Nicholson, Tess Taillon, and Nicole Green serve as reading interventionists, delivering LLI instruction within the construct of our High School master schedule.
- **Check In, Check Out:** School psychologist, Melissa Steenburgh is championing this Tier 2 intervention for students demonstrating patterns of misconduct or disengagement. This intervention is appropriate for externalizing issues (discipline) as well as internalizing (missing school, frequent nurse visits, tardies, etc.), providing specific and positive feedback to help correct behavior and/or reinforce appropriate behavior. Feedback is directly linked to core values (RISE) and is frequent and consistent.
- **Social Skills Groups:** Mrs. Kastner and Miss Steenburgh will be introducing social skills groups for students to foster the development of prosocial skills in the following areas: friendships, communication, nonverbal listening skills, social norms, anxiety, problem solving, conflict resolution, coping skills, etc.
- **Academic Lunch:** A student may be assigned Academic Lunch in the event that a student fails to complete an assignment(s). Academic Lunch is intended to provide student(s) the additional time necessary in school to complete a missed / late assignment. Teacher will communicate directly with student(s) in the event an Academic Lunch is assigned. Note: This is NOT an ISS lunch detention and Lunch A will be housed in the Band Room with Mr. Bariteau, and Lunch B will be housed in Room 222 with Mr. Green.
- **Academic Ninth Period:** A student may be assigned an academic ninth period with a teacher if they require additional support with the academic skills being taught in the

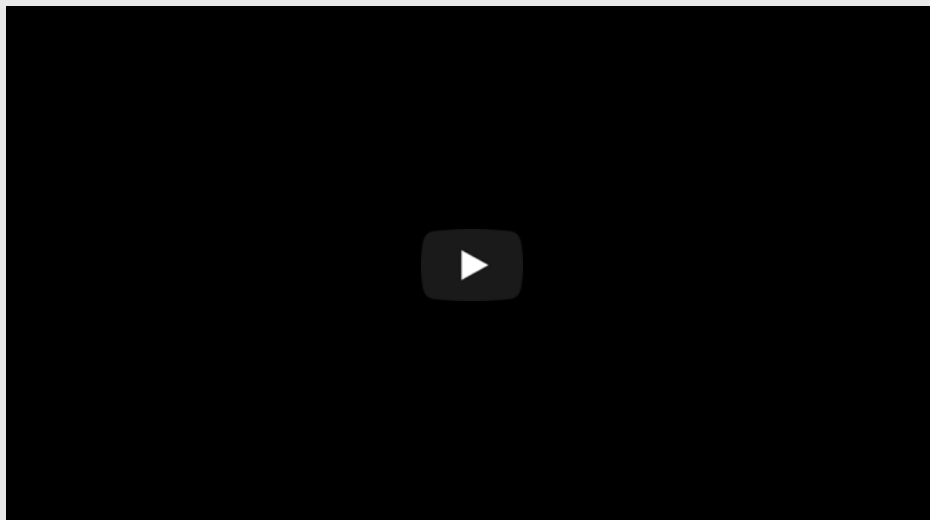
classroom. Teacher will communicate directly with student(s) in the event an Academic Ninth is assigned. Note: This is NOT a detention, rather, it is a structure intended to provide students the additional time and support necessary to be successful in the content area

Tier 3 Launch at the HS

- **Success Strategies Course:** One RtI model addressed in Mattos' text which the team supported for implementation at Naples High School was a Success Strategies course "designed to assist students who have not been successful in school to develop the habits necessary for them to achieve in school, to be on track for graduation, and to set education and/ or career goals beyond high school. Instructional time would be spent on developing students' organizational and study skills and strategies for effectively functioning in their academic courses."
- **Mentoring Program:** Bill Murphy, school counselor, is orchestrating and leading our work with a mentoring program, intended to support students at Tier 3, as follows:
 - When students are unsuccessful academically or behaviorally
 - When other interventions seem to fail--CICO
 - When a student is having significant issues getting along with others
 - When students exhibit very little motivation and effort or just do not seem to care about work and/or behavior
 - When students seem to have little guidance and/or support in the home
 - When a student seems suspicious of the school and staff
 - For those kids that always seem to get a bad bream and are perpetually in trouble and/or failing
 - When a student is frequently suspended and/or is in danger of expulsion
 - When a student does not seem to respond to anything else
 - When a student does not seem to have any significant connections to learning

2017-18 LAUNCH: ACADEMIC LEADERSHIP COURSE

Our Academic Leadership course was BoE approved for the 2017-18 school year. The intent behind this course was twofold: to provide an additional leadership opportunity for students and to provide a vehicle for student mentoring. We currently have several students registered for this course and have secured placements for these students with teachers across many content areas.

Course Description:

This is an opportunity for independent students to serve as peer tutors and/or student teaching assistants in the classroom. Participation requires commitment, self-initiative and strong interpersonal skills. Students may be assigned to assist peers in learning labs or to support teachers' work within a class. Students will be under the direction of a teacher, administrator or counselor. Responsibilities and roles may vary depending on assignment. Applications are required for entry into the class. Upon approval, students must sign a commitment contract.

2017-18 LAUNCH: ADDITIONAL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

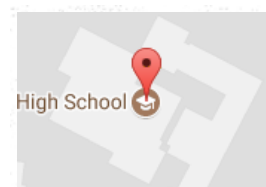

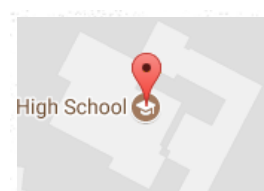

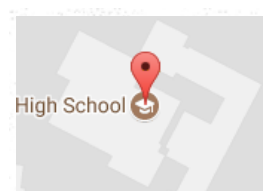

Board of Education Report

Katie Piedici, Director of Pupil Personnel Services

I would like to start off by saying thank you to Tammy Matthews and Midge Guererri for the support they have given me as I started this role. I am very proud of the special education department and excited to be working with a wonderful group of educators!

Over the last two weeks I have been hard at work placing new students in programs and supporting programming of our current students. I have set up times to meet individually with members of my department. My goal is to use these discussions to guide the work we do in the PPS department this school year. I have also been hard at work attending workshops and conferences to ensure that I am up to date on current regulations and best practices for our students.

I am happy to say that co-teaching is up and running in the high school and the elementary school. This is an initiative that was began last year and I look forward to developing our co-teaching teams over the upcoming year. Bridget and I offered an opportunity for high school co-teaching pairs to work together on our August 31 Conference day. This was a wonderful opportunity for teachers to collaborate and prepare for the upcoming school year.

We are gearing up for annual reviews of our High School students. This is a very busy time for our Jr/Sr high school special education department as they work tirelessly to ensure that evaluations and updates are ready for CSE meetings to begin.

Rebecca Slade our department chair in the High School has worked to set up appointments with the ACCES-VR counselor to visit our school once a month. ACCES-VR stands for Adult Career and Continuing Education Services- Vocational Rehabilitation. This is a great opportunity for our students to be counseled on ways to best meet their employment goals.

Our Jr/Sr high school counseling department has had a busy start of the school year. They have placed many new students and have adjusted many existing students schedules. They work very hard to be creative with scheduling and find ways to meet the needs of all of our students. Bill Murphy was recently appointed to positions on the Rochester Area Colleges Advisory Board and the Finger Lakes Community College Career Services Advisory Committee. He will also continue to hold a position on the Finger Lakes Community College Counselors Advisory Board.

Financial Statements

- Independent Auditors' Report – Unmodified “clean” opinion
- Difference between Fund Financial Statements and District-Wide Financial Statements
 - The first part of the financial statements is the district-wide financial statements that provide both short-term and long-term information about the District's overall financial status, which include property, plant and equipment and long term debt. The second part of the statements is the fund financial statements that focus on individual parts of the District, reporting the District's operations in more traditional fund detail than the district-wide statements.
- Highlights – District-wide statements
 - District-wide Statement of Net Position
 - Overall there was a decrease in assets and deferred outflows of resources of approximately \$1.6M. Significant changes included the \$800K decrease in capital assets related to current year depreciation expense, \$3.8M decrease in net pension asset related to changes in pension related items, balanced with a \$2.6M increase in deferred outflows related to changes in pension related items.
 - Overall increase in liabilities and deferred inflows of resources of approximately \$1.7M. Of the total \$36.0M liability balance and \$208K deferred inflows of resources balance, \$32.9M is made up of long-term liabilities which major items include serial bonds of \$18.7M, other post-employment health benefits liability of \$10.1M, compensated absences of \$2.8M and GASB 68 related liabilities and deferred inflows of resources of \$1.1M.
 - The District continues to record the long-term liability for the other post employment healthcare plan. GASB 45 requires a liability of \$10,141,338 to be recorded on the District-wide financial statements. This is based on the actuary valuation obtained by the District.
 - Increase in the net position balance by \$31K to \$7.7M at year end. The net position balance includes \$7.3M in net investment in capital assets, \$5.4M in restricted net position and a negative \$5.1M in unrestricted net position (caused by items such as the OPEB and Pension related liabilities).
 - District-wide Statement of Activities
 - Total revenues increased over the prior year approximately \$343K. This is a result of an increase in the tax levy, general state aid, and BOCES aid.
 - Total expenditures have increased over the prior year approximately \$1.3M with the largest increase being in the instructional category, which are due increases in the other post-employment health benefits liability and pension related changes allocated as a percentage of payroll in each function. In general, the largest expenses to the District continue to be general support, instructional & transportation.
